Noah Buchholz is a PhD student in Religion & Society at Princeton Theological Seminary and lecturer in the Program in Linguistics at Princeton University. Previously, he served as Assistant Professor of American Sign Language and Deaf Studies at Bethel College. His research interests include: liberation theology, postcolonial/decolonial theory, critical geography, and Deaf studies. He holds a BA in Biblical & Theological Studies and Classical Languages from Wheaton College and an MDiv and ThM from Princeton Theological Seminary. Noah travels nationally and internationally presenting his ASL literary works. His performances includes Deaf cultural folktales, original fiction stories and poems, improv, stand-up comedy, and some works that are translated from English to ASL. Noah has a lot of experience with ASL-English translation. He served as a consultant on ASL Bible translation team at Deaf Missions for 6 years. He also consulted Romanian Sign Language and Russian Sign Language Bible translation teams. He has worked with theatre interpreters at Steppenwolf Theatre and DePaul Theatre in Chicago.
